- 11. On shorter sides, when starting, fold over small bit of binding before starting to pin. Then pin that piece flush with the edge of the other binding; otherwise, following previous steps. (picture)
- 12. When reaching the far edge, repeat by cutting off excess fabric leaving approximately ½ inch for folding and sewing down. (picture)
- 13. Then turn quilt over and follow previous steps.
- 14. At each of the four corners on the sides, there will be a space between the front and back of the top and bottom (short) binding strips. This should be secured by whip stitching the front and back together. (picture)

REMEMBER TO NOT SHOW KNOTS-BURY YOUR KNOTS WHEN STARTING AND WHEN FINISHING.

19th Century binding lies flatter and uses approximately ½ as much fabric as today. The finished quilt will NOT have mitered corners; but that is the 19th Century look.

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
