

Flying Geese Pinwheel 9" Finished



This block has eight flying geese units made into a fun pinwheel block. Instructions are for making the flying geese units are one at a time. This block is also known as Flying Dutchman.

Cutting Instructions

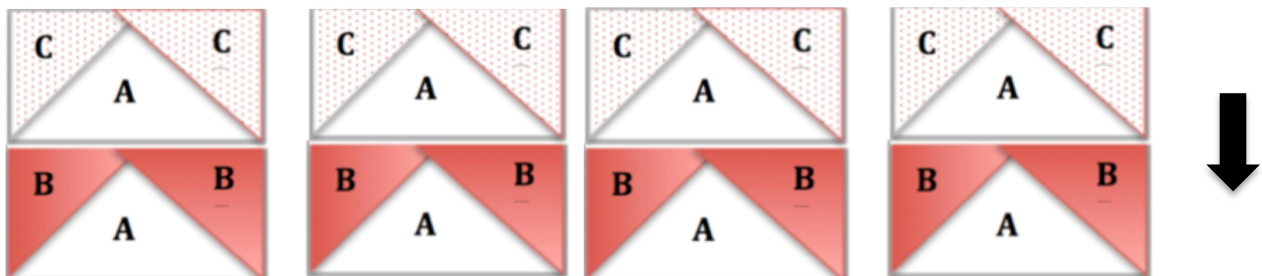
Fabric A	Fabric B	Fabric C
2 3/4" x 5" rectangle	2 3/4" x 2 3/4" square	2 3/4" x 2 3/4" square
Cut 8	Cut 8	Cut 8

Making the Block

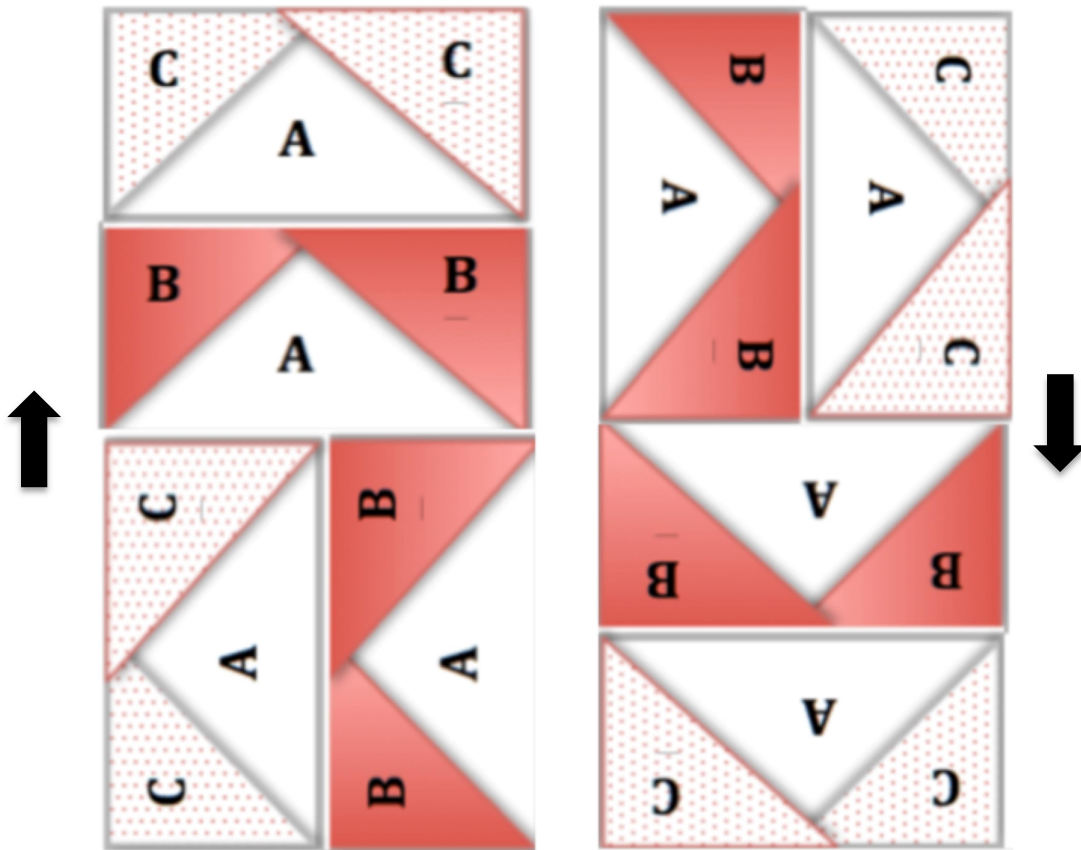
1. Making one "Flying Geese" unit. Sew two 2 3/4" (Fabric B) square to one 5 x 2 3/4" (Fabric A). Trim seam to 1/4". Press outwards. Make four.
2. Repeat sewing two 2 3/4" (Fabric C) to one 5 x 2 3/4" (Fabric A). Make four.



3. Sew units into pairs as shown. Press seam downwards.



4. Refer to picture for layout and pressing. Press final seam open. The Flying Geese Pinwheel block should measure 9 ½" unfinished.
