Mel Beach presents "Challenge Yourself"

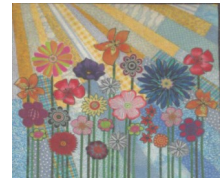


October 4, 2018 Tina Curran presents "My Design Process –From Concept to Quilt"

The purpose of this talk is to share Tina's design process, step by step, highlighting the inspirations and obstacles that pop up along the way. Her hope is that this talk will demystify the process for others and encourage them to start designing their own quilts.

This workshop involves making a pieced background, fussy cutting flowers (from floral fabrics), adding cut stems, and then fusing and raw edge appliquéing all the flower heads and stems to the background fabric. The class project finished at about 24" x 24".



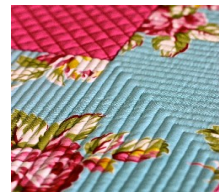
November 1 Heidi Stagno presents "Hints for Successfully Quilting Your Quilt"

Heidi Stagno Workshop: "Rulers, Templates & Stencils"

A little bit of ruler work goes a long way. Enhance your free-motion and feathers with some straight lines. The refined quilting makes the quilt pop! The contrast between the clean straight lines and the movement of the free motion makes for a high end show stopping look.

And away we sew!

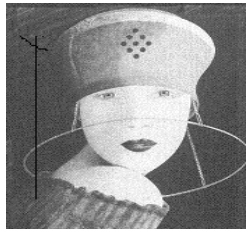

Fallbrook Quilt Guild Executive Board Meeting ---- July 20, 2018 at the home of Sylvia Williams

General- Call to order- Sylvia Williams 10:00 am

Treasurer's report- Betsy Shirkey gave the treasurer's report. She provided the board with the new 2018-2019 annual Budget, which will be published in the August newsletter. An audit of the treasurer's books was performed today. Members present were Betsy Shirkey, Jan Conklin, Karen Johnston and Sylvia Williams. The audit went well, with only a few minor discrepancies, which will be, resolved with future bookkeeping improvements.

Way's and Means update- Jan Conklin reminded everyone that any money collected for opportunity quilt tickets in August must be deposited in August to allow for a accurate report for the Raffle registration report that will be filed on August 31, 2018. We're planning on taking the opportunity quilt to the San Diego Quilt show. Also, looking into showing the quilt at Wine & a Bite on August 10, 2018.

Membership report- Mara Woods and Karen Johnston are planning on recording our membership names and information on Goggle sheets and have opened a Fallbrook quilt guild email account with this in mind. This account will be a viewable database, for the use of the various committees that have need to access member names and contact, such as the directory, ways & means and the newsletter mailings. At this time, we have 62 renewing members and 5 new members. All members who have renewed by July 31will be entered in a drawing for a free workshop.

Programs for 2018-2019- Collette Ford reported that all information regarding Speakers and workshops are on the guild website. She is looking for to a great year. The board agreed the Collette's suggestion to raise the non-member for classes.

Compliance officer report- Dianne Parker is creating a monthly chart to allow for accurate tracking of reports and files required. She will need a member count for the August 31, 2018 filing for insurance through the SCCQG. Dianne confirmed that the Charitable Raffle Guidelines state that at least 90% of the gross receipts generated from the sale of raffle tickets are used by the organization for its member benefits and that we can not exceed 10% of gross receipts in executing the raffle itself. This represents the cost of the printing of the tickets for sale only. The costs associated with making the quilt are part of "Design & Construct" budget and are not included in the raffle report.

Old business to address- In order to save money, we are currently in the process of closing up the storage unit holding the stored items for the Quilt Show and the Country Store. Betsy Shirkey has agreed to store the poles/chains and remaining Quilt Boutique items. Sandy Scott will store committee books and other items associated with the Show. The country store committee will store items for the country store. The old scrapbooks/photo albums compiled in the early days of the guild have been donated to the Fallbrook Historical Society. This will allow guild members access to viewing these if they like. There are 13 albums in all, representing guild history from 1987 to 2003.

New business to address- The items included in new business will be addressed again at the next board meeting.

In order to improve the updates on our Facebook page, we need to determine who are the approved admin's for the page. We would like have this page be much more user friendly to allow guild members to connect.

We would like to explore changes to the Guild Bylaws. Items discussed include 1. The executive board should all vote to approve the annual budget prepared by the treasurer. 2. Should the guild bylaws be included on the website? 3. Should we allow an extension of time past three years that an officer can serve on the executive board? The meeting was adjourned at 1:00
