Programs and Workshops

August 1, 3 Lyn Mann (quiltsbylyn.com) Sylvia and I did a bit of recon at the El Camino Guild when Lyn came to them in April. This speaker was delightful and full of information as well as beautiful quilts. She must be a bit camera shy because I could find no photo of her. (She came to us in November of 2016 and presented Confessions of a Skewed up Quilter. Ring a bell?) This time, Lyn's lecture will be the same that we saw at El Camino, so we know this will be really good.



Head for the Border –presentation. Lyn shows a variety of borders, way beyond my standard 2" followed by a 4"border. She had a ton of items in her trunk show and presented in a way that elicited chuckles along with *ooh* and *ahhs* throughout her presentation.

Head for the Border-workshop Finally, a class that will help you get started planning a pieced border for your quilt. Most of the time spent will be working with the quilts that students bring in and together you will brainstorm the perfect border for it. Simple directions of where to start and what to look for will be covered. There will be multiple handouts listing the basics as well as giving some important formulas and piecing instructions. This will strictly be a design class and there will be no sewing involved.

So dig out that UFO quilt top that just needs that special border, and let Lyn to lead you to the next step of making the quilt spectacular
