Appetizers: A through H

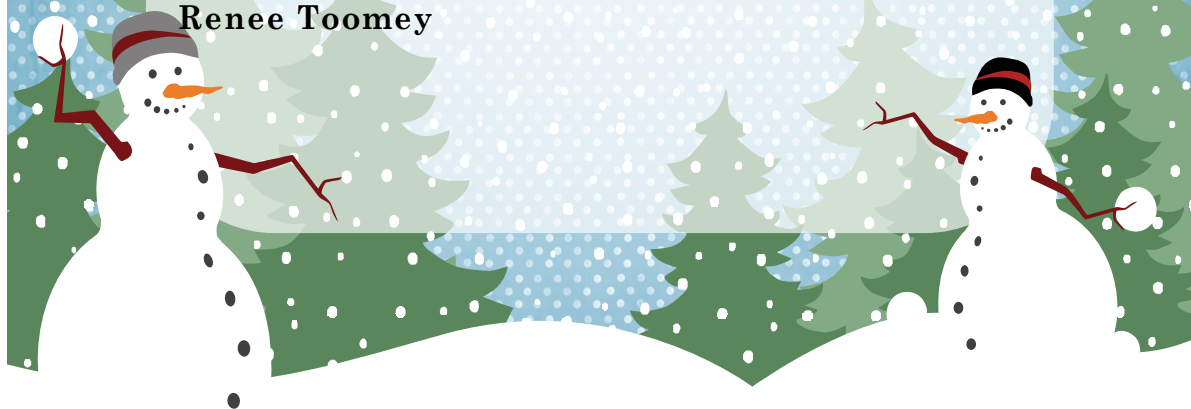
Main Dish: I through P

Pilgrimage to the International Quilt Festival Houston - 2016

In early November, Andrina Lilly, Linda Flynn, Marie Sundsboe and I made the trek to Houston to attend the world renowned International Quilt Festival. Approximately 55,000 people descend on Houston in late October for the two-week event that is Fall Quilt Market for industry professionals and in the second week, the hundreds of classes, hundreds of juried quilts on display and nearly 2500 vendors who had come from all over the world to participate in this epic event. To give you an idea of the scope, there were quilts and vendors from as far away as Japan, South Korea, Australia, Brazil, France and the UK.

It was the first time I have ever been to the Houston festival and we were all blown away by the hundreds of amazing quilts on display and the multitude of vendors offering unique patterns, threads, fabric, felted wool and a plethora of hand-dyed fibers.

Here are some of the highlights of prize-winning quilts:

- The Best of Show, Reflections of Cape Town, by Cynthia England won a cash prize of \$12,500!
- If you love Baltimore album quilts, take a look at Founder's Award winner Baltimore in Bloom quilt by Sally Magee.
- "Unknown Man" by Marina Landi and Maria Lucia Azara of Sao Paulo, Brazil won the Gammill Master Award for Contemporary Artistry.
- Superior Threads Master Award for Thread Artistry went to Mikyung Jang of Seoul, South Korea, for her "Suwon Hwasung", a magnificent castle.

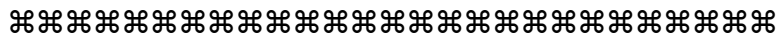
