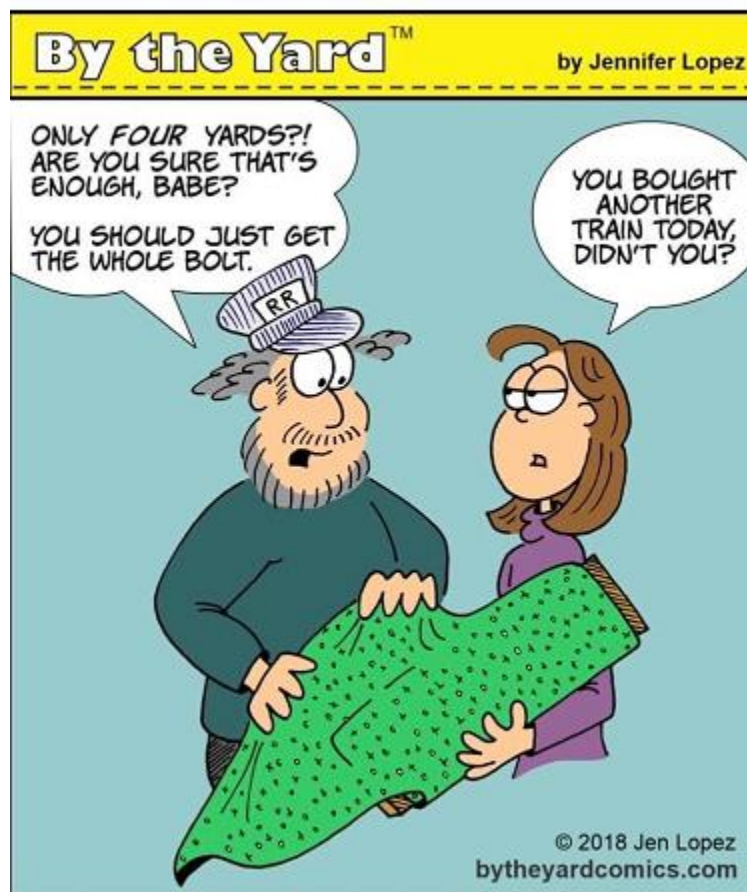

Our quilt guild is off to a great start in 2022 with two great speakers and workshops. First up in February is Wendy Mathson of Escondido who is an expert with Storm at Sea. She combines it with Snail's Trail to create a most interesting pattern and quilt. Wendy is well-known in the quilting world, having penned the iconic quilt book, "A New Light On Storm At Sea Quilts." She will be presenting her program, "Designing With Storm At Sea And Snail's Trail Blocks" at our February 3 meeting. Then on Saturday, February 5, Wendy will guide us in her workshop called "Storm At Sea And Snail's Trail Piecing With TRIMplates." Her work can be viewed on her website: www.quiltsbywendy.com. You won't want to miss either one of these upcoming events.

Then in March, we will be hosting Peggy Martin. Her website is www.peggymartinquilts.com She has published several books, "Quick-Strip Paper Piecing" and "Paper Piece The Quick-Strip Way." Peggy has been quilting since 1981, when she made everything by hand. Fast forward a few years when faster and easier ways of doing things were discovered. Peggy jumped on the bandwagon and never looked back, using her own quick and easy methods. Peggy's program for us will be "Enjoying The Journey," a look at quilts spanning her 30+ years of quilting and teaching. She will explore a wide variety of patterns and concepts, as well as how her style and sense of color has evolved. The workshop scheduled for March 5 is a popular one—"Split Compass." This is a 15" block composed of mirror-image octagons and no circles, producing a dramatic wall hanging.

Of course, there is lots of fun planned the next few months and I hope to see you there!
