I hope to see you at our next meeting.

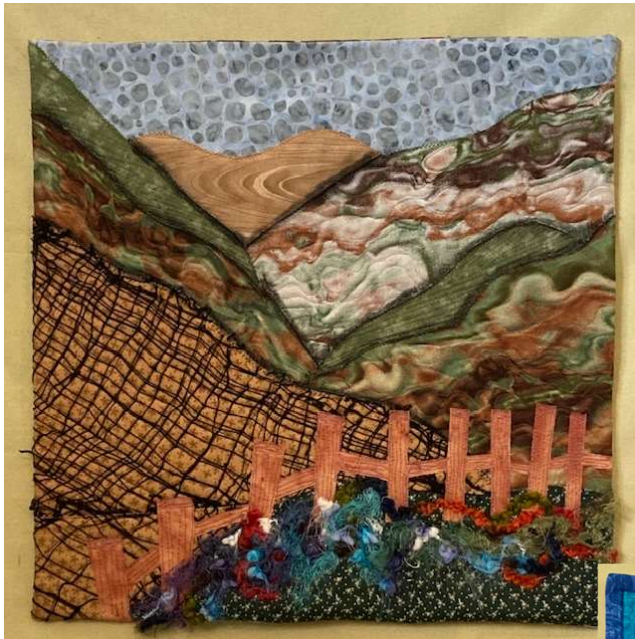

Calling all quilters!!

For those new to the guild, our show is a two-day show the first full weekend in November in odd-numbered years. This year the dates are November 3-4, 2023. We set up on Thursday, November 2.

The show is not a “judged” show, meaning that the main purpose is to let the community see what we do. Everyone is encouraged to enter at least one quilted/crafted item, and everyone is expected to help on some committee or other.

It’s time to get your blank entry forms completed for each quilt you’ll enter. Get out your quilt scraps for the entry forms. You’ll also need a color photo (of the finished quilt) or a sketch (if the quilt is not finished when you turn in the entry form).

Jody Malone is the new Entry Forms committee chair, and she has almost nothing to add to her notebook for the Quilt Layout committee! Only FOUR entry forms have been turned in! I know you all have quilts to enter; I’ve seen all the quilts at Guild meeting Show and Tell. I know many of you have taken classes from our speakers. There is no limit to the number of entries you may turn in. Please mail your entries to Jody Malone when they are completed (see email sent out by Cindy Stephen on June 25), or bring them to the next guild meeting (July 6 or August 3).” The deadline is August 19, 2023.

In the next few months, you’ll have the opportunity to sign up to help on one or more of the committees that will need your help. This is a great opportunity for all members to share their talents with the guild.

THANKS TEAM, FOR VOLUNTEERING YOUR TIME AND CHANNELING YOUR ENERGY INTO TAKING ACTIONS AND MAKING DECISIONS THAT WILL BENEFIT OUR MEMBERS!

Re our Treasure Chest, Tricia Voight reported that our income in May was \$168, derived from ticket sales at our fund-raising tables during the meeting, whereas our expenses were \$1352.76, representing the fees we paid our Program speaker to present “ColorStory,” as well as the Dye-Painting Workshop.

(NOTE: The income collected from the workshop’s attendees will be reported at the next Board meeting, but does not cover the entire cost of the workshop. THE GUILD ALWAYS SUBSIDIZES THE COST OF THE WORKSHOP BY APPROX. 40 TO 50%, IN ORDER TO KEEP THE FEE PAID BY MEMBERS LOW)

Re our upcoming programs, Ann Turley spoke about how “The UnSeamly Event” program for July will involve solving a mystery using the clues she provides. There will be teams of 6, with the winning team receiving gifts. Our August program will feature a speaker on the handwork of indigenous South Americans to create Molas, which are intricate reverse-applique works of art. Our September program will involve a lecture and workshop given by Jeff Warner. Sign up for the Bargello Snowflake workshop soon, because there are supplies that need to be obtained and fabric that needs to be prepared PRIOR to the workshop!

Sandy Scott, our famed Quilt Show Queen, announced that Diana Rash is moving to Chicago and therefore member Jody Malone has volunteered to take on the task of receiving the entry forms from members who wish to showcase their quilts. The entry form must be in Jody’s hands no later than August 19. They can be turned in during the July and August meetings OR mailed to Jody at the address shown on the form.

After Show and Tell, we had a final chance to nibble what remained of the lavish spread.

FQG Executive Board Meeting Minutes for May 10, 2023

President Sharon called the meeting to order at 1:10 p.m. Other Board members present were Karen Johnston, Penny Bottomly, Linda Rosensteel, Gayle Luczyk, and Mara Woods. Not present were Ann Turley, Tricia Voight, and Collette Ford. Jan Conklin and Sandy Scott were also present.

The amended April minutes were approved.

Sharon received a report from Treasurer Tricia Voight showing our April income was \$362, and expenses were \$156.64, giving us a total of \$35,029.93, *which is \$5000 less than a nonprofit with an operating expense of \$20,000/yr (which is the cost of running the FQG) should have available, based on the recommendation that nonprofits maintain two years of operating expenses in the bank.*

Karen Johnston, 1st Vice President of Programs, mentioned that it could be useful, in the future, to develop a contract protocol if we need to cancel a workshop for any reason (usually, the reason would be too few participants). Since workshops given by program speakers are usually contracted for about \$700 or more (of which participants pay less than half the cost, and the Guild pays the remainder), a \$150 fee given to the program speaker if the Guild needed to cancel would be preferable to not having a workshop but still being obliged to pay the speaker the full contracted price. We decided to table this discussion until another time.

Penny Bottomly is still pulling together a presentation of military quilts to retired service members. She also thought it would be fun to hold a small quilt show in the years between the major quilt show we hold every two years. She described another Guild's informal ("drive-by") show of quilts hung in the yards or porches of members. She also is worried about finding someone(s) to fill the Ways and Means Board position.

The next meeting will be a joint get-together of the outgoing board and incoming board, where information is shared and transferred. Sharon will host at 1 pm, on June 7.
