Meetings and Workshops for 2018/2019

November 1 Heidi Stagno presents "Hints for Successfully Quilting Your Quilt"

You've finished piecing your beautiful quilt top. Now you are faced with how to quilt it. Join Heidi, owner of Heidi's Longarm Quilting Center, as she shares the elements she considers when deciding on how best to enhance the quilt top through the quilting.

November 3, 2018 Heidi Stagno Workshop: "Rulers, Templates & Stencils"

A little bit of ruler work goes a long way. Enhance your free-motion and feathers with some straight lines. The refined quilting makes the quilt pop! The contrast between the clean straight lines and the movement of the free motion look makes for a high end show stopping look.

NOVEMBER 3 HEIDI STAGNO WORKSHOP INFO.

Have you wondered what all the hype is about ruler work, but have been hesitant to invest in the ruler foot and rulers without knowing how to use them? A lot of your questions can be answered at the Rulers, Templates and Stencils workshop with Heidi Stagno on November 3, 2018. Thanks to the generosity of Jan at the Quilter's Cottage you can take a "test drive" of the ruler foot and rulers during the workshop. Jan will provide two ruler feet, one Bernina sewing machine and Sew Steady table (and I'll provide another machine, table and one set of rulers) so you can try the ruler foot and rulers during class. Just prepare your quilt sandwich as described in the [Workshop Supply List](#).

Please email me at programs1819@cox.net if you'd like to enroll in this class. At that time, please let me know if you will purchase the rulers from Heidi. Each ruler is \$24.99. She is offering a 20% discount on the price of the rulers, if you pre-order. Please pre-order by October 19th.

In this workshop Heidi will cover the following skills:

How to pre-mark (grid) your quilt to accept ruler placement.

Selecting the correct reference lines on the rulers.

Learn how to hold and move the ruler to ensure proper guiding of the tools.

Design options and choosing the right layout for maximum impact.

Create secondary designs in a quilt.

Cross Hatching, Channel Quilting, Pivot and Rotate, Cathedral Window style quilting.

Evenly distribute scallops and spines for feathers on ANY size border.

Keeping lines straight according to the quilt and stitch in the ditch.

NOVEMBER MYSTERY QUILT INSTALLMENT—Ann Turley

“Bringing It All Together, Part One”

1. Let's put 18 of those tone-on-tone rectangles to use this month by sewing one light 2-½” square to one end. Press to the rectangle.
2. Using the Corner Units from October, sew this new section between two matching or coordinating corners. Use the photo reference and be mindful of placement. You will be making eighteen (18) half-blocks.

That's it, until January, so you will have plenty of time to finish your holiday projects and work on the mystery quilt.
