Minutes of Fallbrook Quilt General Membership Meeting August 7, 2014

Call to order: A General Membership Meeting of the Fallbrook Quilt Guild was held at the Fallbrook Community Center in Fallbrook CA. The meeting was convened at 6:30 p.m. Presiding was 1st Vice President, Ann Turley, who led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Business/Committee Reports:

President's Announcements: Reminded Executive Board and Committee Chairs of next Board meeting tomorrow morning Friday, August 8, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. at the Quilter's Cottage. Board meetings are the 2nd Friday of the month.

Treasurer (Linda Musillami/Linda Flynn): 2014-201 budget will be published in the September newsletter and voted on during the September General Meeting.

Ways and Means (Sew and Sew 2 Friendship Group): Opportunity Quilt venues at first two Hot Summer Nights on July 11 and July 25 went very well with two more scheduled Aug 8 and Aug 22 nights scheduled. Sign-up sheet circulated for the SD Quilt Show.

Membership (JoAnne Russell/Sylvia Williams): 2 new members, 7 guests!

***Minutes of Fallbrook Quilt Guild/Committee Chair Executive Board Meeting
August 8, 2014***

Call to order: An Executive Board/Committee Chair Meeting of the F.Q.G. was held at the Quilter's Cottage, in Fallbrook CA. The meeting was convened at 10:00 a.m. Presiding was 1st Vice President, Ann Turley. Members present were: Anne Turley, Marie Sundsboe, Christy Smith, Diana Rash, Linda Musillami, JoAnne Russell, Ardis Duhachek and Sylvia Williams.

Items discussed:

Previous Minutes: Approved

Treasurer's Report: Reviewed line items on the draft 2014-2015 budget. The budget will be published in the September FQG newsletter and the general membership will vote on the budget at the September general meeting.

Projected deficit for 2014-2015 budget is -\$5660. Current balance is \$80,000. (needs correction?)

Question was raised as to why there was not a budget for advertising. 2011-2012 income was \$280 from advertising. Discussion regarding supporting FQG's advertisers and letting the advertisers know where you saw the ad.

Motion made by Sylvia Williams to approve **publishing the 2014-2015 budget in the September newsletter with general membership vote at the September 2014 general meeting**, seconded by Diana Rash. Motion passed.

The beginning monthly balance and all expenditures and income will be posted in the FQG newsletter each month. Publishing the budget is required for compliance with FQG's non-profit status.

1st Vice President: Concern that the workshop budget of \$1530 may not cover expenses. Discussion regarding costs. The FB Senior Center rental is \$175/day. July speaker fees were \$943.84 with 7 paid attendees, August speaker fees are \$950 with 12 paid attendees.

FB Public Utility District conference room rental is free. Some restrictions on food/drink within the room although breaks might be taken outside. Pictures could be taken prior and after the workshops to document the state of the room. Ann will further explore the FPUD conference room for workshop use.

2014-2015 schedule includes 9 workshops with 3 non-workshop months. Jan 2015 will be a non-fee "UFO Workshop" for members who can bring in unfinished projects for technical/artistic ideas and completion. Next speaker will not be until Feb 2015. Upcoming workshops are "Hinge Quilts" in March 2015 and Cindy Meyers in May 2015 with "improvisational quilting". Discussion to develop ideas to promote workshops and increase interest.

Treasurer: SSCOQ insurance was sent in mail today with a current count of 91 members. P.O. Box rental paid.

Ways and Means: Opportunity quilt venue at Hot Summer Nights on July 11 and July 25 sold ~ 130 tickets with Aug 8 and Aug 22 nights scheduled. First two venue sales covered the \$100 rental fee so the rest will be profit. Will be showing "Ants on Parade" at the SD Quilt Show. Sign-ups went well with a few time slots left.

Newsletter: Submit by 15th of the month. Plan to revise mailing/email lists to delete non-members after the membership directory is published. Some members receive both mailed and email versions. Need to encourage email to reduce costs of printing and postage.

Motion made by Marie Sundsboe to email FQG newsletters to all members to save postage/printing with exception only if member does not have access to a computer, seconded by JoAnne Russell. Motion passed.

From the Membership Table

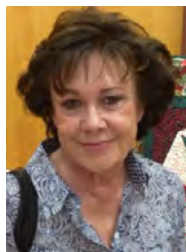

Block of the Month – from the Kingston, WA Quilt Shop

Kit includes 3 squares of Fabric - or cut three squares as follows:

Floral 7 ¼" x 7 ¼"

Black 5 ½" x 5 ½"

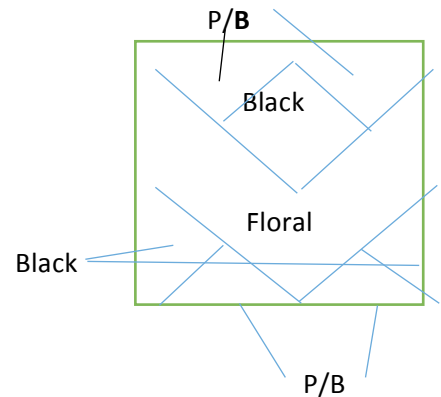
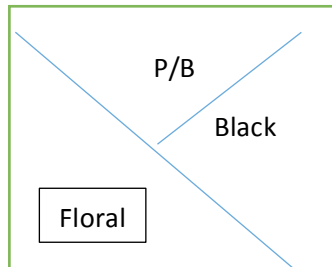
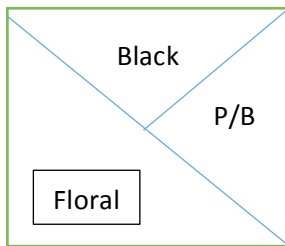
Pink or Blue 5 ½" x 5 ½"

Cut all 3 on the diagonal twice.

Lay out the pieces to make 2 of each of the blocks pictured below on the left.

Sew together and iron seams open. Square them up to 4 ½". Take the blocks you've just made and lay them out so they look like the block below to the right. Sew together matching the seams as needed.

Iron seams open. Trim the block to 8 ½".

There's a new quilting class in town -- and it's NOT for your grandmother!

It's an "Artful Quilting" class focussing on color, line and design. There will be both lecture and lab/participation time for the class directed project; that means that each student makes their own quilt based on the same core pattern.

All adults (motivated 10-year-olds and up), men and women, of all skill levels are welcome. But there's a limited enrollment of 20 students (a waiting list will be maintained). Students bring their own supplies and equipment for class use (or work at home); students may audit the class (attend without making a project).

The class will meet in the chapel at Sunrise Christian Fellowship (463 S. Stage Coach Lane in Fallbrook) for 6-week sessions on Tuesday nights from 6:30-8:30 pm. The first session includes Sept. 16, 23, 30, Oct. 14, 21, and 28 (no class Oct. 7). Two other sessions are planned for the spring.

Karen Cunagin will provide instruction, inspiration and encouragement for making beautiful and useful objects. She says " We're doing this for the love of God, people and fabric!" Karen teaches color and design in the fiber arts for the San Diego Community College District at the West City Campus in Point Loma. The themes in her personal art revolve around the intimate world of family, garden and spiritual work.

Though most of her textile compositions are machine sewn, she spends hours hand finishing many pieces with stitch, sequins, and yo-yos. There may be painting, printing and other surface design.

Her work has been shown in Visions: The Art Quilt 2006 at the Oceanside Museum of Art, regional juried shows and international publications.

In 2010 she completed four giant fruits/cloth sculptures (each 5 feet in diameter) that are permanently exhibited in the award-winning Fallbrook Library. That commission also included the 'Reading Avocado" and the giant sunflower in the children's area.

Karen was nominated for the teacher of the year award 2011 by The Professional Quilter magazine. She serves on the board of the Visions Art Museum in San Diego.

Cunagin moved to Fallbrook in 1987 and early on became a part of the arts community setting up her tent as one of the first vendors in the Village Square at the corner of Main and Alvarado. At that time she was making sculptural cloth dolls and Bead Ladies. (She's still making Bead Ladies and has sold over 6000 of them to date!)

She taught community education classes through Palomar College that ranged over 17 years including the fiber arts topics of traditional rug hooking, cloth doll construction and artful quilting. The classes met in the Fallbrook Community Center until Karen became the first instructor to access the yet-to-be-renovated avocado packing house now know as the Fallbrook School of the Arts campus on Alvarado Street. (Palomar College eliminated the Community Education department in 2009.)

As well as teaching the semester-length classes in San Diego, Cunagin presents inspiring lectures, workshops and trunk shows for quilt guilds, museums and festival groups. She

challenges her fellow fiber artists to take little risks in their quilt work that can lead to courage in others areas of real life.

Students will be able to attend by completing registration info and paying the session fee (\$60) in advance. A materials/supply list will be provided for the first class.
