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The Rosette and its Relatives - Full Day February 9, 2019

Work with your rotary cutters and Marti's acrylic templates (Sets A or B) to make this versatile family of blocks. Marti especially likes the Rosette (p.32, Vol. 1, Encyclopedia of Patchwork Blocks) because with that one block you can practice half-square triangles, Flying Geese style triangles and the Square within a Square technique. There are a host of other similar blocks you'll love making this way.

Supply List:

Cutting supplies: rotary cutter, ruler and mat Routine sewing supplies Sewing Machine, thread, etc.

Fabrics Needed for Rosette:

At least three coordinating fat quarters with good contrast; you can also use 5-8 fabrics, depending on the look you are after.

Fabric Selection Tips: (If you are making a sample & kitting - none of this matters.)

Try to avoid strong directional fabrics. Look for variety, don't bring fabrics that all look alike. If you are already working on some kind of super Sampler, think about making these blocks in those fabrics, or think of these as the start of a Sampler quilt- what fabrics would you like? Or assume classes are to learn a technique and not to spend a lot of time fussing with fabric choice and bring almost anything!
