9 1/2" square

For machine applique: Pattern is full size and does not include a turn-under allowance.
For needle-turn applique: Make a template of the pattern. Trace around the template on the right side of the fabric (or reverse to change direction of the rabbit), and add a 1/8" to 3/16" turn-under allowance when cutting the fabric.

Cut a 10 1/2" square for background. Center and pin the rabbit on point, and applique in place. Use black floss and a satin stitch to embroider each rabbit's eye. Use an outline stitch to embroider the remaining details. Trim to 10" square. Stitch a pompom to each rabbit, and trim evenly to size.

Hop to it, and you'll finish in no time!

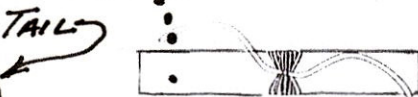

Making Pom Poms

- Cut a 3/4" x 5" rectangle of cardboard.
- Cut an 8" length of yarn. Center the piece of yarn on the cardboard rectangle and tape it at both ends of the cardboard.



- Wrap yarn around the center of the cardboard approximately 60 times. Unfasten the ends of the taped piece of yarn and tie them in a tight double knot around the loops.



- Turn the cardboard over and cut the yarn loops through the center.



- Fluff the pom pom and trim the ends of the yarn to make a nice round ball.
