1896 - One of the earliest patchwork quilt patterns, this nine patch variation, was called "a Plain Block" in the Ladies Home Journal in 1896. When these 3" blocks were made, in the second quarter of the 19th Century, it may have just been called a nine patch.

Block Number 1 is a simple nine patch and is constructed like the sample below using a $1 / 4$ inch seam.


Block Number 2 consists of three strips. The light color is sewn in the middle as illustrated below using a $1 / 4$ inch seam.


The blocks can be set straight or on point.
