1896 - One of the earliest patchwork quilt patterns, this nine patch variation, was called "a Plain Block" in the Ladies <a href="Home Journal">Home Journal</a> in 1896. When these 3" blocks were made, in the second quarter of the 19th Century, it may have just been called a **nine patch.** 

Block Number 1 is a simple nine patch and is constructed like the sample below using a ¼ inch seam.



Block Number 2 consists of three strips. The light color is sewn in the middle as illustrated below using a ¼ inch seam.



The blocks can be set straight or on point.
