## Center Pinwheel 9" Finished



Cutting Instructions Using Three Fabrics

| Fabric A-Background | Pinw | Fabric B- Pinwheel |  | Fabric C-Squares |  |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| $31 / 2$ " Square | Cut 2 | $31 / 2$ " Square | Cut 2 | $23 / 4$ " Square | Cut 4 |
| $23 / 4 "$ x 5" Rectangle | Cut 4 |  |  |  |  |

1. Half Square Triangle (HST) Units: Make four.

- Place one $311 / 2^{\prime}$ Fabric A square \& one $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B square right sides together. Fig. 1
- Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Fig. 2
- Sew $1 / 4$ " away from the drawn line on both sides of the line. Fig. 3
- Cut the square in half on the diagonal line. Fig. 4
- Open and press towards Fabric B. Trim to $23 / 4$ " square. Fig. 5

2. Sewing the block. Refer to the diagrams.


- Sew one HST to one Fabric C $23 / 4$ "Square.
- Press towards Fabric C Square
- Measures $23 / 4$ " x 5 ."
- Make 4.

Add one Fabric A rectangle.
Press towards HST unit. Measures 5" x 5". Make 4.


- Arrange the units as shown and sew together.
- Press towards arrows.

3. Constructions: Sew the two sections together to complete the block. Press seam open. To "spin your seam flat," see websites listed below. The Center Pinwheel block should measure $91 / 2$ " unfinished.
