Minutes from the General Meeting

Fallbrook Quilt Guild July 8, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 6:09 pm by Ardis Duhachek, host for this meeting. Frannie Marr, our new president, introduced herself. She is a new quilter and has been a member of the Guild for 2 years; she has lived in Fallbrook for 7 years.

New officers were announced: Treasurer Barbara Anderson, Membership Co-chairs Linda Rosensteel and Barbara Erickson, Secretary Tricia Voight, Ways and Means Penny Bottomly. There is still a need for a chairman of the Hostess Committee. Anyone interested please let Frannie know.

Treasurer's report was given: ending balance from income was \$1250 for the year; \$4648.28 expenses; \$33,817.76 current balance. Fifteen memberships have been received as of today. (See Budget Worksheet at end of newsletter.)

Karen Johnston, our new VP, is working on increasing more social activities for meetings. Ardis reported the new officer installation will take place at the August 5 meeting. Dixie Johns reported on Quilts of Love. She received three new quilts this month for a total of 206 quilts turned in for past year. The business meeting then concluded.

Patricia Belyea, our evening speaker, was introduced. Her topic was Japanese textiles and Okan Arts. After a trip to Japan, her quilting was positively influenced by the techniques she observed. Patricia shared many interesting facts about the Tokyo Quilt Festival 2020, the largest quilt festival in the world. It features many levels of competition of different styles of quilting using a variety of fabrics and techniques. There is also an international exhibit, which hosted the Quilters Guild of the UK this year. Patricia gave us some interesting facts about quilting in Japan. Quilting came to Japan In 1976. There are more quilters in Japan than the U.S. Quilt shops don't exist in Japan. To study quilting one must sign up with a sensei (teacher) and pay to attend their workshop. After 5 years you may be called a quilter. As a member of one sensei's group, you cannot attend any other classes, or you will be expelled by your sensei.

Patricia developed a style of curved piecing influenced by Japanese quilting. Using a background fabric, she slices curves creating a design and then pieces in the featured fabric. It appears like bias applique, but fabric is actually sewn into the background. Okan Arts is the business Patricia owns with her daughter Victoria.

The meeting ended with Show and Tell with work from Tricia Voight, Bev Aguilar, Addie Matcham, Charlotte Seidman, and Sandy Scott. The meeting was adjourned.

Our speaker is Allyson Allen of Sun City
and her program is 51 FUN WAYS TO USE FABRIC YO-YOS.

Allyson, who first learned to sew as a child from her mother and an older sister, has taught quilting in many settings including women's shelters, public and private schools, and in as many as three different prison institutions for the California Youth Authority. Allyson has continued the family tradition by teaching her nieces, Krysta and Madison Wright, to quilt while imparting important lessons in family and African-American history. She uses traditional materials to create unique, dimensional textile art, quilts, dolls, and handmade books.

Allyson shares: "Three years of my Special Exhibits for Mancuso Quilt Shows are photo-documented in my book, *Quilted Pages – Story Art Quilts*.

My second project and pattern book is *CLOTH*PAPER* STITCH&GLUE - Mixed Media Projects & Altered Book Art.* My fun quilt pattern line is *'Run With Scissors.'* "

Sales Tax is based on prior FY sales (July - June) for Non-Quilt Show Taxable Sales Budget Assumptions:

- 1. We have a credit for room rental for 3 months and will only pay 9 months in 2021/2022
- 2. We will only have 4 workshops in 2021/2022
- 3. Membership dues income is based on 85 members @ \$50/pp
- 4. We will not have a Quilt Show in 2021/2022 but will resume in 2022/2023.
- 5. We will raffle an Opportunity Quilt in 2021/2022 but not require members to purchase tickets
- 6. Includes the cost for Zoom membership for a year \$160.00 in Membership Expenses.
- 7. Should the storage shed be in Guild Storage?
