#### Guidelines

**Hospice Quilts**: Fabric that is not of baby quilt type, may be perfect for those given to Elizabeth Hospice. The size may need to be a bit bigger, about **42**" **x 50**", and recipients may be male or female. We have kits made up, or feel free to turn to your own stash and tap into those creative juices. The folks at Elizabeth Hospice have warmly welcomed all that Dixie has dropped off.

**Baby Quilts**: You may use your own fabric, or pick up a kit. Most of these quilts are about **36" x 42**". The base hospital is now maintaining a bin with quilts in it in the peds unit, hoping to tap into those new babies when they come for their three-day checkup. In fact, Dixie's military neighbor just showed a picture of it. She looked in and sure enough, our quilts were there.

**String Quilt:** Thanks to all who turned in their string block. The cheery, colorful blocks have been assembled into the one pictured here and will have the calmer fabric as shown in the corner for the back. If there are blocks still out there, kindly turn them in by October. Also, remember to shorten your stitch length to help the member who gets to remove the paper.

Many thanks for Deb Raver to putting the blocks together and Betty Hall for meticulously picking out the paper.



**Lastly**: Members continue to go above and beyond in the quality and attractiveness of the quilts turned in. Opening the box on Dixie's porch and seeing the latest quilts dropped off continue to warm her heart. It is obvious that you do not treat them as "just" charity quilts, but more like something you'd give a member of your family. 24 quilts were dropped off on July 27 and were warmly received by two ladies from the Navy/Marine Welfare Organization. Kits will be available for pick up or drop off at guild meetings or on Dixie's porch:
