The deadliest and most destructive fire in California history erupted at dawn on Nov. 8 in the drought-parched Sierra foothills northeast of Chico, and within minutes, stiff winds whipped it into a monster. At first what has come to be known as the Camp Fire devoured 10 football-field-size chunks of terrain every minute — and then, with a startling ferocity that has become all too familiar in recent years, it rampaged through Butte County neighborhoods. With little to no warning, residents fled the town of Paradise and surrounding villages down the few car-choked escape routes, but many never had a chance. More than a week later, the blaze continues to burn as officials log the ever-increasing tallies of devastation: Scores dead, hundreds missing, and nearly 10,000 homes destroyed. Recovery is expected to take years.
