Upcomíng Programs

<u>February 2 Program</u>: **Shirley McGuire "Wool Applique and Beyond"** Shirley will tell us everything we need to know about using wool in our projects.

February 4 Workshop: "Needle Felted Fashions and Gifts"

We will learn all about wool applique techniques including felting the wool to add dimension.





March 2 Program: Cindy Myers "Coloring My Quilt World"

Not a boring color wheel theory lecture, but Cindy will share how she chooses colors for her quilts. She'll also be bringing some of her intricate Judy Niemeyer quilts to share.

March 4 Workshop: **"One Block Wonder"** (small quilt using panels)

Using 7 panels and the One Block Wonder method for making quilts, we will use 6 of the 7 panels to cut up for the hexagon blocks and the leftover panel to use as your focal point to build around. We will be using small pillow panels that will allow the student to learn all the steps in making a One Block Wonder: quilt, cutting, sewing and designing in class.

Label Making Notes

At Karen's request, I'm sending notes from my schoolhouse label session.

Products Tested:

Derwent Inktense Pencils with Liquitex Fabric Medium Stained by Sharpie pens (different from other Sharpie pens) June Tailor (JT) Colorfast Sew-In Fabric Sheets for Inkjet Printers The Electric Quilt Company (EQC) Inkjet Fabric Sheets C&T Publishing Quilter's Freezer Paper Sheets FolkArt Acrylic Paint with Liquitex Fabric Medium

Findings:

- Acrylic paint with fabric medium maintained color the best, but it requires skill, patience and possible throw-aways.
- Stained by Sharpie pens retained color much better on colorfast label fabric than on 100% cotton.
- EQC sheets fed through my inkjet printer much better than JT, but the EQC instructions did not heat set the ink and color washed out. When I heat set the EQC labels they worked quite well. Heat-setting instructions after printing on an inkjet printer:
 - · Let label sit for at least 15 minutes
 - · Press on cotton setting for 1-2 minutes
 - · Get completely wet, then sop up excess water with a paper towel
 - · Iron until completely dry

• I had limited success with freezer paper. I had trouble getting it to stick to the fabric well enough to get through my printer, and the color faded badly.

FQG Board Mínutes, October, 2022

The board did not meet in October

FQG, November 3, 2022 Meeting Minutes

In President Sharon's absence, our 1st VP, Karen Johnston, presided and began the meeting at 1:34 p.m.

Treasurer Tricia Voight reported that during October, we received income of \$557, and expended \$1527. CoChairman of Membership Linda Rosensteel reported that we have 80 members on the roster, and 2 guests attended the meeting.

Ways and Means Chair, Penny Bottomly, asked members who are tired of feeling guilty about their unfinished projects (UFO's) to donate them to the Guild so they can be sold and earn fundraising dollars. She also said that she will host another workshop to make patriotic quilts for Veterans, and asked members to donate red, white, and blue fabrics, as well as backing material.

Dixie Johns and Carol Wilson, our tireless Quilts of Love Ladies, announced that the family of the late and missed Betty Hall would hold an estate sale of her fabric and many other items on November 12. (Dixie and Carol both worked many hours to sort through all the quilting related items, as did Connie Follstad, who ran the sale for the family.)

Karen Johnston announced our program schedule for the coming months. The feature of our December 1 meeting will be a potluck. The Guild does not meet in January. February's program speaker will be Shirley McGuire, talking about felt applique with wool roping and embroidery, while March's speaker will be Cindy Myers, showing how to create a "One-Block Wonder" quilt using panels.

The meeting's "Schoolhouse" program was presented by three Guild members. **Dalia Fonseca** explained and demonstrated how she creates individual hexies and assembles them into a larger unit, multiples of which are put together as a quilt top.

Cindy Stephen demonstrated how she creates unique labels for her quilts, based on her many trial and error attempts to identify the best products to use, after subjecting the labels to hot and other temperatures to see how the inks and materials held up. She showed all her samples and made recommendations.

Ann Turley, who never met a fabric that she couldn't work with, showed us visuals, gave us a handout, and explained the best ways she's found to create a variety of triangles.
