

PATCHWORK HEART FEBRUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH Construction and Assembly Instructions



Scrap-Patch Heart 8" x 8" Block

Packet Includes:

16 squares (1 ½ in) 30's fabrics

2 rectangles (2 ½ X 4 ½) *30's fabrics

Background Fabric:

1 square 2 ½

41 ½" squares – for the ½ square triangles

forming the heart *

2 side borders (6 ½ X 1 ½)

2 top & bottom borders (8 ½ X 1 ½)

ito

Assemble: 16 patch square – Sew together 4 rows of 4 squares sewn together

Sew (4) ½ square triangles to rectangles

Attach one rectangle to top of 16 square block

Attach 2 1/2" square to 2nd rectangle. As shown.

Attach side rectangle (with 2 ½ square0 to the side of heart block

Attach borders as shown.

Ms. Mostek will talk with our guild about the FABRIC, the fabric that is just too beautiful ti cut into small pieces. She has a technique we can all apply. Her lecture will show her "Focus of the Fabric" by fussing cutting and broferie perse applique. She began quilting 20 years ago. "I loved handling the fabric...and those colors! I was instantly hooked. My quilts have always been about color, even from those early quilts. It all seemed to come together, and I set out making quilts. About eight years ago, I left my job as a high school English and art teacher, and took the big plunge into professional quilting. For as long as I can remember.....I have loved color and fabric. My passion is making quilts because it brings together these two things that I love."

Pamela has authored six books in the quilting industry that have been published by Martingale & Co, designed fabric, and taught quilting through out the country; Dazzling Quilts, Quilts from Larkspur Farm, Scatter Garden Quilts, Blossoms in Winter English Cottage Quilts, and Just Can't Cut It.

AFTER ABOUT SIX YEARS OF DESIGNING AND PUBLISHING MORE OR LESS TRADITIONAL QUILT PATTERNS...SHE FOUND THAT MORE AND MORE THAT SHE WAS PULLED BACK TO THOSE EARLY YEARS STUDYING AND WORKING AS AN ARTIST. PAMELA HAS COME FULL CIRCLE COME FULL CIRCLE... ARTIST, QUILTER, AND FINALLY QUILT ARTIST! 

WHAT A BULK BUY ENTAILS

A bulk buy has several different components to understand. First you need someone (purchaser) who has a resale number and is willing to hunt for the best price on a certain item (time is not reimbursed). Then, when that item has been found and the price is good-wholesale pricing- the person contacts the group to let them know the price per the unit, shipping and handling, and yes, sales tax.

In the past I have been the puchaser of Organ needles for commercial embroidery machines. There is always a lot of research to find the best price and trying to find the US distributor can be trying at times. I looked into trying to find the Schmetz distributor, However, their price point break was nonexisting so we all bought our own. A price break is where the distributor will lower a price because you bought more than a certain amount. With the needles The price break was at 1,000 and 5,000 needles.

I have spoken to several guild members who would like to be involved in a bulk buy. The bulk buy would be Warm and Natural. It retails at \$13.50 a yard in the quilt shops. If there is enough interest I will contact the distributor. I will find out what it will take in order for us to get the best buy possible. Now in a bulk buy, there is no minimum per person. Some have said they would buy the roll. Some may only need a few yards. Please contact me with how much you would buy. I know you will want to know how much it will be before you commit. However, I need to know how much everyone is willing to buy so I can find the best price break for the group. 


