Thursday - February 7, 2013 Lecture

A Desperate Housewife's Quilt Journey

In this humorous presentation, Sue shares 25 - 30 of her recent quilts, delighting the audience with stories that will make everyone giggle. Sue takes you through her development as a quiltmaker with her beautifully machine quilted and intricately pieced quilts. She discusses several quilts in detail: the importance of design elements, color, fabric choices, quilting patterns and the inspiration for her quilts.

Saturday - February 9, 2013 Work shop Curved Paper Pieced Flying Geese



Level: Beg/Intermediate to advanced: confident in paper piecing. Students immediately move beyond the basic paper pieced geese by adding a dramatic twist to them and design a small quilt (18" x 24") with curved flying geese. Students will learn how to design, draw, measure, and sew the pattern in class. Sue will discuss in detail many of the options available for using curved flying geese as borders or central design elements. Sue shares many secret tricks to paper piecing. This class is fun! It will open up new horizons to curved paper foundation piecing.



News from your Executive Board

At our meeting on January 8th the members of the board:



- 1. The **July Guild Meeting** will be on the second Thursday, **July 11th -** workshop will be on July 13th.
- 2. The **August Guild Meeting** will be on the second Thursday, **August 8th** workshop will be on August 10th.
- 3. We will have no workshops in October and November.
- 4. January 2014 Guild Meeting will be on the second Thursday, January 9th.

Be sure to mark these changes on your calendar....Also our Quilt Show is scheduled for the 2nd weekend in November - November 8th & 9th.

- 2. Decided to participate in the "California Guilds' Award-Winning Traditional Quilts" special exhibit at the 2013 International Quilt Festival/Long Beach.
- 3. Voted to revise the 2012-2013 Budget as follows:
 - 1. Increase expense budget for Legal Consultation to \$5,000.
 - 2. Decrease budgeted income in 2012-2013 to \$1,946.*
 - * Note that the original budgeted income for Opportunity Quilt ticket sales was \$4200. The actual income from the sale of 2012-2013 Opportunity Quilt tickets is \$3,465; Of this total, \$1,519 was received prior to July 1, 2012 and therefore was posted as income to the 2011-2012 budget. The \$1,946 is ticket sales income that was received on/or after July 1, 2012 and has been credited to the 2012-2013 budget.

This year our Guild has been presented with some unexpected challenges. Your Executive Board has decided to secure the services of an attorney who specializes in laws affecting non-profit organizations, as we must take steps to insure that our Guild is operating in a manner that is compliant with both State and Federal Laws. A copy of the revised budget is in this newsletter.




Quilts of Love
