GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Call to Order: A general membership meeting of the FQG was held at the Fallbrook Community Center in Fallbrook, Ca., on Jan 7, 2016. The meeting was convened at 6:30 PM, by our presiding President Shirley Fleming, who led the Pledge of Allegiance.

President's Announcements:

- Thanks to everyone for coming out tonight with all the rain we had. Please feel free tonight to enjoy the food at any time.
- Welcome to Pat Pardoen and Ann Tracy from Beach Cities Quilt Guild tonight. They are selling tickets for their opportunity quilt "Star Struck" a Judy Niemeyer design. Their raffle is in June at their guild show, which is held at Soka University in Aliso Viejo.
- Minutes of the Dec. Guild meeting and the Dec. Board meeting were approved and published in the last newsletter.
- The next Board meeting will be held on Jan. 15., at 11a.m. at The Cottage.
- Comfort Quilts Adoption Ctr. Of San Diego is asking for us to make 25 quilts for their birth mothers. Size needs to be 40"x 60", in a cheerful theme, but not reflecting babies. We are not forming a committee, but individuals may make quilts if they are interested. Four quilts have already been made and Shirley delivered them in Dec. If you make a quilt, please included a note with your quilt to include your name and address so that they can send you a thank you. Let Shirley know that you have made a quilt and she will collect and deliver them to the adoption ctr.
- Quilts of Love workshop will be held on Jan. 16th at FPUD. They will be working on baby quilts and comfort quilts. Please bring a sack lunch.
- We will be staring the Quilt Buddy committee and program this year. The committee is to make new members feel welcomed and get them involved in the guild activities. Shirley will also be sending a letter to Camp Pendleton inviting wives to the guild and encouraging them to become involved in quilting.
- Guild field trip to reward ourselves for a successful quilt show. If you have any thoughts or suggestions on this, please let Shirley know. Editors note: See board meeting minutes-this has been cancelled.

Quilt Show (Sandy Scott): Show budget was \$7935. We had a total income of \$25069. Expense were \$10232, leaving us with a profit of \$14936

BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Call to Order: An Executive Board/Committee Chair Meeting of the F.Q.G. was held at the Quilters Cottage, in Fallbrook CA on Jan. 15th, 2016 The meeting was convened at 11:00 A.M. Presiding was President Shirley Fleming. Members present were Diana Rash, Christy Smith, Ardis Duhachek, Barbara Vajda, Jan Conklin, Lou Cobb and Anne Ottemann.

Discussion Items:

- Shirley Fleming recognized Diana Rash for her on-call participation as Secretary for Board and General Membership meetings.
- Board discussed idea of using funds to support a reward activity such as the rental of a bus to take a trip to the LA Garment District. The Board also discussed some negative feedback that had been received regarding the idea. The Board was advised to be quite careful of our non-profit status and the rules governing such use of funds. Board decided to table the idea.
- Discussed proposal to eliminate the July 2016 meeting. After reviewing proposal for Quilt University in July and August, Board decided to keep July meeting.
- Board discussed Nominating Committee formation and early decisions regarding returning board and committee members.
 Positions that most likely will need to be filled are: President, 2nd VP, Secretary, Ways and Means, and Newsletter. Other positions are undetermined at this time. Barbara will print out interest slips for the next membership meeting.
- Request was made to move meeting time back to 10:00 am. Board agreed.

Committee Reports:

Treasurer's Report (Barbara Vajda): Income: \$477.50 Expenses: 1010.00 Balance in account is \$33,706.45.

Membership (Ardis Duhachek, Diana Rash): 109 members

Hospitality (Anne Ottemann): Go RED for Women's Heart Health Month in February. Encourage members to wear red.

Ways and Means (Jan Conklin): Opportunity quilt will be at Road to California on Thursday. There are approximately 35 members who have not picked up their raffle tickets. It is written in the bylaws regarding the responsibility to sell raffle tickets. New members may not be aware. Future venues may include Primitive Gatherings, Myrtle Creek, and Old Town Murrieta. Marie Sundsboe and Shirley will be meeting with Jan to audit the last 2 years.

Boutique Group (Lou Cobb): Board discussed some negativity related to request for involvement in making boutique items. Members who wish to be involved may do so and those who do not are not obligated, nor is it a requirement. Sold approximately 60% of their inventory at the show. The committee's activities will continue to generate funds for the guild. To remain fiscally conservative and choose venues wisely, plans for a Christmas Bazaar at the Pettinger House at the Historical Society next December were cancelled.

Your favorite scissors


I prefer Hobbs wool. Bring what you prefer.
