NEW CHALLENGE FOR 2024!

There's a new challenge in the works for the first half of 2024. I'm calling it "It's a Toss-up" and as usual, you've probably never seen anything like it. Here is how it works: There will be six blocks, six colors, and three themes. A simple toss of the dice will determine your fate. Which block, color and theme will challenge you depends on you and how lucky (or unlucky) you are. There will be one common zinger added in March; it's nothing too difficult to include. Your finished product can be no larger than 60" on any side and is to be finished and shown at our JUNE meeting. As with previous challenges, you are free to construct anything that is even remotely quilting/sewing related. Your block can be used only once, or multiple times. It doesn't need to be a specific size or shape. It can be very traditional, very artsy, or very wonky. It can be sliced and reassembled, and it needs to be on the FRONT of your project. Your color should be predominant; you can add any other colors you want. Theme should be made obvious either in the composition itself or in your description/artist's statement. There will be ribbons and prizes based on the block, color and theme you have used. Please see me at the meeting, I have a display board, examples and encouragement galore!


Quílts of Love
