I am really excited to serve as your president this year and look forward to a year filled with friendship, good times and our enjoyment of being together as we share our love of quilting.



SECOND NOTE......JULY MYSTERY QUILT

This month it's all about the cut.

LIGHT: For *yardage*, you will cut *twelve* 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and *six* 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Are you going *scrappy*? Cut $180 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and $96 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles. Place each set into a separate labeled zip bag.

Dark#1: *Yardage*, cut *fourteen* 2 ½" strips. *Scrappy*, 213 —2 ½" squares. Bag and label.

Dark#2: Yardage, cut *five* 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Cut 72—2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles. Scrappy, cut 72—2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles. For both yardage and scrappy, pair the rectangles into 36 matched pairs. Bag and label.

Tone-on-Tone: (coordinates with dark #1 and dark #2): *Yardage*, *three* 4 ½" x 2 ½" strips. *Scrappy*, 36 —4 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles. (Both yardage and scrappy, the rectangles are matched in sets of **four**.)

That's all until August, when we will begin to sew.

FIRST NOTE ... JUNE.. MYSTERY QUILT TO REPLACE BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Have you ever made a mystery quilt? It can be a bit scary not knowing the final outcome, but the fun involved should far outweigh the fear! In a nutshell, each month you will receive a new set of instructions via the newsletter, the website and/or at the meeting. All you need to do is complete the monthly assignments, and by June 2019, you will have completed a beautiful lap quilt! In order to begin next month, you will need to collect some fabrics for this lap quilt:

If you want everything to coordinate:

LIGHT: 1 ½ yd. **DARK #1**: 1 yd.

DARK #2: 5/8 to 3/4 yd.

TONE-ON-TONE: 3/8 to ½ vd.

BORDERS: 1 1/2 YD.

If you want to use scraps, then use nothing smaller than $2 \frac{1}{2}$ x $2 \frac{1}{2}$ "in amounts listed above. NOTE- there will be pieces cut larger than this, to be revealed next month. I will be available at the meetings to answer all your questions.

In JULY, we will begin to cut.

This will be fun!

She was sad to realize that this would be her last Board meeting and thanked everyone who served with her during the 2017/2018 year and the members for making her feel so warmly welcome. There was a lot of fun and a successful year due to everyone's self-less contributions to do what needed to be done.

The drawing for the winner of the Midnight Garden Opportunity Quilt would be drawn tonight and the 2018/2019Opportunity Quilt revealed. Tonight began the start of membership renewals/signups. Turn yours in during June and July and your name will be put in for a chance to win a "free workshop of your choice". Also, be sure to renew/join by August's meeting so you can be in the Directory.

Barb informed those that were changing positions or beginning new ones, to be sure they exchanged the tools of that trade prior to the 12 July Guild meeting – <u>there is NO meeting on 5 July</u>. Committee Chairs were informed that if they believed an increase to their budget was required, to provide the information to Betsy Shirkey (Treasurer) so she could see if it is feasible to incorporate the increase into the 2018/19 and 2019/20 budgets.

By the end of the Guild year, you will have a complete quilt top. If you don't know what to bring for July's meeting, check the June newsletter, gather your materials and bring them to the July meeting to learn where to go from there.

Laura Small informed us that she was meeting with some crafters/knitters, etc. at the Starbucks in Fallbrook on Saturday, 9 June. If you get a chance to stop by, come in and buy coffee, then take a look at some of the fantastic things artists are doing with materials other than just fabric.

Programs: Collette Ford provided a brief itinerary of speakers lined up for the coming year. July will be a "University" meeting with our own members teaching various things they like to do and we will get to see each station for a little bit to be able to get to all the stations.

Ways & Means: The person who sold the most tickets was Carol Carpenter. As the Design & Construct Committee Chair, she drew the winning ticket for the Midnight Garden Opportunity Quilt. It was one of our own members - Jane Carpenter. She was notified by Sylvia Williams as several members came up for Show and Tell.

She had prepared the letter for signatures on the FQG bank account for Sylvia and presented it to her for the additions/deletions of names to the account. Barb informed her she would have to make arrangements with the new signers to go to Chase Bank to make the changes. She informed Sylvia that she would need to decide when the Board meeting would occur along with where/what time. Barb and Sylvia are going to the Community Center after the meeting today to sign the contract for the coming year's Guild meetings. Barb then read a letter received from Quilt In A Day that basically stated they were offering Guilds to come to their store, (day starts at 10:00) and sit in on a taping of Eleanor Burns, have lunch with her and shop with some pretty good sale promotions.
