

June and July

Batik Butterflies in Blue Sky

Materials: These are approximate sizes before cutting:

Background - 9" x 9" Blue Sky (provided for consistency) Butterfly Outline - 4 1/2" x 6 1/2 " Black Body - 1 1/2 " x 2 1/2" contrasting color Large Wings - 2 1/2" x 5 1/2" (Batik same or different than Small Wings) Small Wings - 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" (Batik same or different than Large Wings) Antennae - 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" Black or contrasting color Lite Steam A Seam 2 (or equivalent) - 4 1/2" x 12" (LSAS2)

Read all instructions before starting to get a clear understanding of what is required.

Instructions:

- 1. Press all fabric so that it is flat.
- 2. Use a marker to trace the butterfly pieces (from the back side of this page) onto paper or a piece of clear plastic (use a light box or window pane to trace). Cut out the pieces.
- 3. Pin traced pieces to fabric and cut smoothing edges as you cut.
- 4. Unpin pattern pieces from fabric and pin onto paper side of Lite Steam A Seam 2 (or equivalent). Cut pieces slightly smaller than the fabric. Place the bumpy side toward the wrong side of the fabric pieces and press for 10 15 seconds (or as directed for the product you are using).
- 5. Take all of the pieces to the ironing board. Remove the paper backing from each of the pieces.
- 6. Using the picture above as a guide, arrange the pieces on the Blue Sky background. Lay them down in the following order: Antennae, Butterfly Outline, Body, Large Wings, and Small Wings. Rotate the pieces so the butterfly "flies" to the left or right to provide variety. You may want to trim some of the pieces so that more of the black portion shows.
- 7. Once you're satisfied with the arrangement and trimming, carefully press all of the pieces in place.
- 8. Now the fun and creativity begins. Carefully add stitching to the outer edges of each piece. Let your imagination run wild. Use colored or variegated thread. Use any stitch straight, blanket, small zigzag or decorative stitch. (You may first want to "audition" the stitch on a scrap piece of fabric.) You might try using different thread colors and stitches for the different pieces.
- 9. Now the Butterfly is ready to fly. Press the block on the wrong side to smooth it out.
- 10. Finally trim the block to 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" evenly centering the Butterfly.

Members present were Ann Turley, Sue Colby, Diana Rash, Sandy Scott, Linda Musillami, Christy Smith, JoAnne Russell, Ardis Duhachek, Shirley Fleming and Sylvia Williams.

President's Announcements (Sharon Baker): Lots of guests last night, most will join during membership drive in July. Kudos to Sandy Scott for being ahead of the game this year with the Quilt Show. Sandy has taken suggestions made from last year's show and has made many improvements and included everyone.

President-Elect (Shirley Fleming): To avoid negative comments and to keep free flow of ideas, please consider volunteering for committees to see firsthand what that committee does. Cheryl Jeter has volunteered for the "Driving Miss Daisy" carpool program from the Oceanside area. Shirley thanked the board and chairs for their support.

Committee Reports:

Treasurer's Report (Linda Musillami): Balance is \$16456.15. \$740 was taken in at last night's general meeting with \$405 from the opportunity quilt. All reimbursements should be turned in before the end of the fiscal year to be ready for the new treasurer. Outgoing board and committee chairs should remind incoming chairs of budgets. Approvals are needed only if exceed budget. All budgets for 2015-2016 need to be submitted to new President.

FQG 2015 Quilt Show (Sandy Scott-Chair): Will develop a calendar timeline for quilt entry submission to put in the newsletter. Will look at the entry form to see if there is room to add deadline for submission. Sandy will meet with Sheryl Kaplan at the venue to assess signage placement. Committees will assign or send around sign-ups for jobs at the show. Will need President's message by October for the quilt program.

So Ca. Association of Quilt Guilds: Sandy updated the information for our guild.

Programs (Ann Turley): Need a new quilt stand for programs. Will order another one as under budget since change of workshop location to FPUD. Marie needs to inform Dawn Johnson of 2015-2016 programs scheduled. Discussed need to have a trifold brochure describing programs. 11 signups for May class.

Ways and Means (Ardis Duhachek): Pop up tent used by Ways and Means has disappeared. W&M will obtain a new tent. New opportunity quilt will be revealed at June membership meeting.

New Business (Diana Rash): Discussed the sequence of the meeting agenda including eating first so that food doesn't sit, limiting Show and Tell, having speaker go first. New board and chairs will look at sequencing.

Membership (Sylvia Williams): 111 members including 7 who are not active but who are past presidents. Consider placing these on separate page at back of directory so that roster lists do not include these names. Roster lists are then more accurate for active guild use. Are we ready for a PDF directory? Consensus was that the physical directory is used frequently. Some members do not have access to a printer. Would save printing costs. Members could print their own copies.

Newsletter (Christy Smith): Due by May 17th.

Next Executive Board Meeting: The June Board meeting has been tabled unless a need arises. All outgoing and incoming Board and committee chairs are to meet separately to handle the transition of position duties and binders.

Meeting Adjourned: 11:10 a.m.
