

MYSTERY QUILT TO REPLACE BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Have you ever made a mystery quilt? It can be a bit scary not knowing the final outcome, but the fun involved should far outweigh the fear! In a nutshell, each month you will receive a new set of instructions via the newsletter, the website and/or at the meeting. All you need to do is complete the monthly assignments, and by June 2019, you will have completed a beautiful lap quilt! In order to begin next month, you will need to collect some fabrics for this lap quilt:

If you want everything to coordinate: LIGHT: 1 ½ yd. DARK #1: 1 yd. DARK #2: 5/8 to ¾ yd. TONE-ON-TONE: 3/8 to ½ yd. BORDERS: 1 ½ YD.

If you want to use scraps, then use nothing smaller than $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " in amounts listed above. NOTE- there will be pieces cut larger than this, to be revealed next month. I will be available at the meetings to answer all your questions.

In JULY, we will begin to cut.

FALLBROOK QUILT GUILD MINUTES OF 3 MAY 2018 GENERAL MEETING

The meeting was called to order at 6:38 pm by Barb Vajda, President. Barb welcomed our members, guests and visitors, then led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The next Board meeting will be held at the Cottage on Friday, 11 May from 10-12. Notices: The San Diego Quilt Show is coming up 20-22 September. Beach City's Quilt Show is on 2-3 June. See the table by Membership for fliers/information.

Barb asked the new prospective Board members to come stand in front of the podium to be introduced to the membership. Tina Rainey motioned that they all be voted in and Barb Anderson seconded the motion. All members raised their hands in acceptance of the new Board. Barb read all the names of the volunteers for the other positions for 2018-19. Barb thanked all of the volunteers. The new Board will be installed at our Pot Luck meeting on 7 June. Barb announced there would not be a turnover meeting this year. She asked everyone currently in a position to please get with their new counterpart to change over materials/binders and discuss as necessary prior to the July meeting.

Newsletter Deadline: The deadline for items to go in the guild newsletter is May 15th. Any items should be sent to our new newsletter editor, Diane Trappen at QuiltDLT@aol.com.

Treasurer's Report: Betsy Shirkey reported our income for April was \$1389, expenses were \$1439.96 leaving a bank balance of \$32,174.23.

Membership Report: Tina Rainey reported that we had 42 members and 4 guests (Barb Erickson, Beverly Gilby, Charlotte Sidon and Paula Hammer) in attendance tonight.

Block of the Month: Ardis Duhacheck stated that all the blocks for this past year are on the Guild website. She showed how she did her blocks and put them together as a fun Patriotic quilt. The intent this year was to learn new blocks/techniques and put them together to make something rather than have everyone make a block a month, bring them back and only 1 person win all the blocks made. Ardis's quilt top was really cute.

Programs/Workshops: Collete Ford stated that she was passing around clipboards for members to sign up for various things. She asked the members to sign up on the "University" clipboard for what they'd like to teach at the July meeting. She asked that those who would be able to house speakers this coming year to please sign up on that clipboard that will be going around. For members **willing to host a speaker**, you receive a **free workshop**. Collete stated she has Mel Beach coming in August, Tina Corran in October, Heidi Stegno in November (Ruler work), Marti Michelle for 2 workshops in February and in May there will be something scrappy. If you have suggestions for other speakers, please make contact with Collette to discuss.

Show and Tell: Several members brought in their myriad of quilted items and photos were taken by Irene Althaus to be placed on the Guild's website.

Speaker: Sylvia Williams introduced our speaker, Becky McDaniel and her husband Doug to speak about what she called "Her Applique Journey".

Drawings: The drawings were held after Show and Tell. Jewell Burke won the Monthly drawing; Cup & A Quarter winners were Sylvia Williams, Betty Hall, Beverly Gilby and Andy Hard. Birthday drawing winners were Betty Hall, Collete Ford, Barb Erickson, Connie Folstad, Paula Hammer, Irene Althaus, Barb Anderson, Doug and Barb Vajda. There was one other that I didn't quite write down. I apologize for missing your name.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:40 p.m.

FALLBROOK QUILT GUILD BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF 3 MAY 2018

Fallbrook Quilt Guild Board Meeting Minutes 11 May 2018 Meeting began at 10:08

President's report – Barbara Vajda asked the Treasurer if a date had been set to formulate the 2018 -2020 Guild budget. Betsy Shirkey stated no date had yet been set and that she, Sylvia Williams, Jan Conklin and Barb Vajda would get together soon to formulate a two year budget proposal.

Jan Conklin Sent an email asking that the Board discuss doing Opportunity Ticket printing online and not including photos of the quilt with the ticket packages.

The Board discussed both suggestions; Sandy Scott stated the photos were only \$.13 each via Costco and Dixie Johns stated Walmart was a little less than that. We will continue to include a photo with each package of tickets and the ticket printing will be done the same as last year. Barb provided an update on how Renee Toomey was doing after her knee surgeries. The Board signed a get well card and Barb mailed it that day. Andy Hard (Sunshine) will be notified to send a card from the Guild

Treasurer's Report – Betsy Shirkey provided a spread sheet for attendees. Income for April was \$417 and Expenditures were \$1,174.34.

Membership – Tina Rainey reported there that 53 people signed in at the April meeting (48 members/5 guests (4 passes & 1 paid). Current membership total is 95. Tina asked Sandy if she had the membership form on her computer so she could have a copy. Tina suggested that the "interested in helping out" section should be removed from the form since nobody remembers what they checked and they aren't interested when the Nominating Committee contacts them. It will be removed from the form and be made available in January when members will be asked to fill one out prior to the formation of the Nominating Committee for the following year.

Vice President – Sylvia Williams reported that all of the 2017-2018 programs are finished for this year and she did it all "under budget". Sylvia described to the Board the type of stuff that the Guild is storing in a storage facility (5 large totes of "finished goods" that could be sold to members at some of our meetings, 4 tables, 2 coolers, 2 boxes of baskets and a large cabinet with various photos albums and scapbooks. There was discussion about where to house the items actually required to keep. The Brandon Street storage facility in Fallbrook could house everything we MUST store in a 5x5 unit with a high ceiling for \$45/month vs our current space that will cost \$151/month starting in August. More details to follow as the committee proceeds through the inventory.

 2^{nd} Vice President – Collette Ford presented more speakers on top of her last list and has some commitments already. She has Shannon Brinkley for March and Christy Fincher (Sharon Shamburg's daughter) for April. She is working on Nancy Oda possibly coming for September. Collette has a pretty good year planned out for us – yeah!

Other discussions: Sandy Scott will mail out our new directory to those members living out of state.

Barb Vajda stated at the Guild meeting that we should hold off until July to pay membership dues. That is no longer the case. Members may make their dues payment as soon as they choose. HOWEVER, Membership **will not** be accepting credit cards this year for dues. Deadline to make the directory is August meeting.
