FQG Executive Board Meeting Minutes for April 12, 2023

President Sharon called the meeting to order at 1:15 pm. Other Board members present were Ann Turley, Tricia Voight, Collette Ford, Linda Rosensteel, and Mara Woods. The long-standing, tireless, and supercapable backbone of the Guild–Jan Conklin and Sandy Scott–were also present. Not present were Karen Johnston and Penny Bottomly.

The March minutes had already been accepted via an email vote and sent to Cindy much earlier than usual.

Treasurer Tricia Voight reported that for the month of March, we had income of \$362 from our raffle tables, but this figure does not include the income earned from the April workshop. Our expenses were \$137.91, which included the annual cost of \$100 for membership in the Chamber of Commerce. Tricia will be picking up the Guild's mail at the Post Office.

ACTION ITEM: Per Tricia and Jan Conklin, all board members need to turn in their respective budgets no later than the June meeting so that the 2023-24 budget can be finalized.

Membership Chair Linda Rosensteel reported we now have 92 members, four of whom joined at the April Guild meeting. Regarding renewals for the 2023-24 year, she will accept checks now from members, but won't deposit them until July 1, the start of our new fiscal year, in order to keep this year's and next year's finances separate.

Our Nonprofit Compliance Chair, Collette Ford, told us that the State Department of Justice, which approves our raffle application, has decided to change its fiscal year to coincide with the calendar year on Jan.1, 2024. Regarding the need to report the number of members we have by October to renew our insurance, Collette said that it's important that we count in our total membership all past presidents who no longer routinely attend meetings.

Ann Turley presented a Programs update. Eight people have signed up for the May workshop on painting fabric with Claudia Dallas Gomez. In June, we will have our installation of new officers, as well as a Luau potluck.

Ann is working toward providing us with entertainment for our December meeting/party. She will be asking a local singing group of high schoolers to perform, but since they have to attend school during the day, she will ask if they can perform during the evening. The Board voted to have our December meeting in the evening.

Re our Quilt Show this November, Sandy Scott reported that the cost of renting supplies we need from Abby Party Rental will be \$3800.

The next meeting will be May 10th, 1 pm at Linda Rosensteel's home. The meeting adjourned at 2:50 pm.
