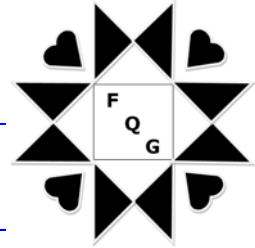

## President's Message—March 2014

This year is literally zooming by, I feel like I just took my Christmas tree down and March is almost upon us. I understand why some people just leave their decorations up – tacky but convenient.

Well Guild members, you know what that means .... it's time to select our Executive Board Members and Committee Chairs for the 2014-2015 year. At the March meeting a nomination sheet will be passed around – please read the bylaws in the back of the directory. There is a brief description of each position. I am confident you all have something to contribute.

I truly hope that those who have served in their current position for less than two years consider remaining in those positions. Anne Turley is our Second Vice President and will automatically serve as the First Vice President for the upcoming year. I know she has some great speakers lined up for the coming year.

The Guild is continually acquiring quality speakers for our meetings. We have even shared speakers with other Guilds to share the expense. However, due to the ever increasing cost of speakers, the Board feels it is reasonable to raise the fee of the workshops from \$30 to \$35, about half a yard of fabric. Trust me – that is still a killer deal. Classes at most Quilt Shows are well above that with a lot more students, fees for parking, and a really crappy lunch selection. I truly believe this modest increase to offset some of the rising costs is more than reasonable.

There are several bylaw items the Board would like the membership to consider for our next meeting. The discussion for each topic will be limited to 10 minutes. Please review these proposals and be prepared to raise any objections:

1. President's registrations fees:
  - A. Members who have served as president prior to 2013 will remain lifetime members and will not be required to pay the annual dues. Membership dues will be waived only for the President during the year (s) they serve as President after 2013.
2. Membership Dues:
  - A. Membership Dues shall be \$30 annually, due by the July meeting, for the upcoming year.
  - B. Members will not be required to purchase opportunity Quilt tickets as part of the membership dues. *Members are encouraged to support the Guild by selling a minimum of 30 tickets and participating in the showing of the opportunity quilt since this is a significant portion of the Guild's income.*
3. Scholarship
  - A. The Board would like to award a single scholarship of \$1500 to a High School senior that attends a public school within the geographical area of any member in good standing. The bylaws will be reworded to be more concise and alleviate future confusion.
4. Excursion Coordinator
  - A. Membership needs to decide if there will be an excursion coordinator in the future.
5. Quilt Show
  - A. All members are expected to participate in the Quilt Show in some capacity other than exhibiting a quilt. Members shall be given an opportunity to choose a position within a committee.
  - B. Members who do not sign up will be assigned a detail according to their last name.
  - C. Members may trade position assignments, but all members should donate a minimum of 4 hours to the show.
  - D. Assignments will be tailored to accommodate members with particular skills and/or physical limitations.
  - E. A member of the Guild who is not on the Quilt Show committee should be selected as the fiscal assessor to provide oversight of all Quilt Show expenditures and ensure the show is operating within budget. *Do members believe it is necessary to have someone approve all expenditures over a specified amount?*

Well there you have it – Please think about these issues – this is your Guild and we all need to participate.

The next Executive Board meeting is March 21, 2014 at the Cottage at 10:00am. Please drop by and give us your thoughts if you cannot make the March 6, 2014 meeting.

### CHEESY BAKED DIP .. From Sue Burns

8 oz sour cream  
8 oz cream cheese  
16 oz cheddar cheese, grated (sharp or mild)  
4 oz chopped green chili's  
1/4 - 1/2 cup green onion (suit your own taste)  
(from triedandtasty.com)  
1 round bread loaf, hollowed out

Mix first five ingredients together and put into the hollowed out bread loaf.

Bake at 305 Deg Uncovered for 1 hour.

Serve with leftover bread, vegetables, crackers, or chips.

**Note: Recipe also called for the following, which I omitted:**

- 1 c. chopped ham,
- 1/2 pound chopped bacon

### PEANUT BUTTER BALLS — Carol Kratzer

1 -1/2 cup graham cracker crumbs  
(finely crushed)  
1 cup butter (or two sticks)  
1/2 cup chopped pecans (I used more)  
1 cup finely grated coconut  
1 box Confections powdered sugar  
1 - 12 Oz. jar CRUNCHY peanut butter  
1 tsp. vanilla  
2 to 3 pkg. (10 Oz.) semi sweet  
chocolate chips

Melt butter and place in large bowl.  
Mix all ingredients (peanut butter last). Form into balls; pressing mixture together (about walnut size).

Place on wax paper.

Melt chocolate chips (small amount at a time) and, with a spoon, roll around the peanut butter balls in the chocolate. Return to wax paper (or foil).

Refrigerate.

Can be frozen and taken out as needed.

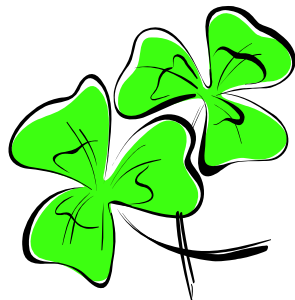
*FQG History Group* invites interested guild members to join our next project, Mill Girls, the first female industrial work force in history ... 1820-1860

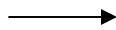
