

Introducing Our Friendship Groups! The Sew 'n' Sews II



The Sew 'n' Sews II (otherwise known as the Sew 2s) friendship group includes Chris Brewer, Jewell Burke photo), the (missing from Carol Carpenter, Denise Cohen, Ardis Duhachek, Ann Harris, Gayle Luczyk, Diana Rash, Sandy Scott, and Ann Turley. The group meets the second Friday of the month at each other's homes and occasionally takes a road trip.

In March they are planning a trip to Temecula to see the rug-hooking exhibit at the Temecula Valley Museum, followed by lunch and perhaps a trip to one or more of the quilt shops in Temecula.

They will also start a special project they've chosen as a group, called a round robin. Each person will bring something to use as the center of their project, along with an idea for something to be used for the following rounds. A round can consist of all four sides of the center, the top and bottom or two sides of the center or adjoining sides (connecting at one corner).

The idea for the first round will be drawn from a hat at the meeting in March, and each person will make that round for their own project before the meeting the following month, using the technique drawn (i.e., stars, flying geese, storm at sea).

At the April meeting, each project will be shown, and the next round will be drawn. For May, each member will have completed the second round for their project and bring it to show the others. And so it will continue until finished.
