

We are in for a real treat to have Sally Schneider. Sally is one of our big ticket presenters, as her workshops are in demand throughout the US. She presents frequently for AQS and was at their March show in Lancaster, PA where the fees to attend her *Confessions of a Scrap Maniac* lecture was \$20, and attending her *Happy Days* workshop was \$100. Sally is a quilt designer and author currently living in Albuquerque, New Mexico. She has been quilting since 1971, and has made several hundred quilts since then. A specialist in scrap quilts and built-in borders, Sally has written ten books. Her eleventh book, Scrap Quilts Fit for a Queen (or a King), is in progress. Active as a quilting teacher since 1980, she has also been as a quilt-book editor and selection panelist for The 20th Century's 100 Best American Quilts. She has been nominated as one of the AQS's All-American Teachers and for The Professional Quilter<sup>TM</sup> magazine's Professional Teacher of the Year. 

The deadline for a scholarship up to \$1500 is quickly approaching. April 21, 2014 is the deadline for applications to be submitted for the Fallbrook Quilt Guild scholarship.



This scholarship is being offered to any graduating high school senior in the Fallbrook Quilt Guild membership area who will be attending an accredited college or university during the 2014-15 academic year.

While not a requirement, preference *may* be given to someone who has a family member or close friend in the Guild. Preference *may* also be given to someone connected to quilting and/or fiber arts.
