Peanut Butter Rice Krispie Treats (served at the October meeting) <u>Ingredients:</u>

8 cups puffed rice cereal

- 1 1/2 cups peanut butter
- 2/3 cup agave nectar

1 Tbsp vanilla

Directions

Line a 13x9 inch dish with parchment paper or wax paper with an overlap at each end

Pour the puffed rice in a large bowl.

Melt the peanut butter and agave nectar over low heat until liquid and stir.

Add the vanilla and stir until blended.

Add the puffed rice and stir until well mixed.

Pour mixture into prepared pan and press down hard with the overhanging parchment or wax paper.

Refrigerate for an hour before cutting into squares.
