Start the holiday season by making this fun, easy wall hanging or table topper. This is the time to get over your fear of fusibles and put them to good use. We'll select a palette of holiday motifs from our festive fabric, attach the fusible, cut away, and build a wreath. You'll end the day with a quilt top ready to turn into a wall hanging or table topper.

You'll need floral fabric to cut up, a dark background fabric, and fusible web. Most important, you need small, sharp scissors. Get the complete supply list when you sign up at our November meeting. Workshop fee \$20.
