FQG MEETING MINUTES, OCTOBER 6, 2022

Ann Turley and Karen Johnston, as Vice President co-chairs, led the meeting in the absence of President Sharon Boehm.

Tricia Voight, Treasurer, reported that the Guild had income of \$463, and expenses of \$1737 for renting the Community Center's room and for printing our updated brochures.

Speaking for Penny Bottomly, Ways and Means, Ann reported that Penny still needs donations of unfinished projects (UFOs) that members wish to purge from their sewing space, which will be offered for sale to other members. Members can hand them off to Penny before the meeting, or at the beginning of the meeting. Karen is accepting other donations.

Linda Rosensteel, Membership co-chair, reported that we now have 81 members, as well as seven guests attending the meeting.

Jewel Burke is our new Sunshine Chair, sending out cards to members who are ill, sad, or worse.

Dixie Johns reported that she distributed 41 Quilts of Love kits and received 59 finished quilts from members, all of whom are expected to contribute two small quilts per year for our Community Service mission, which enables us to maintain our nonprofit status with the State of California.


