October 4, 2018 Tina Curran presents "My Design Process – From Concept to Quilt The purpose of this talk is to share Tina's design process, step by step, highlighting the inspirations and obstacles that pop up along the way. Her hope is that this talk will demystify the process for others and encourage them to start designing their own quilts.

This workshop involves making a pieced background, fussing cutting flowers (from floral fabrics), adding cut stems, and then fusing down & raw edge appliqueing all the flower heads and stems to the background fabric. November 1 Heidi Stagno presents "Hints for Successfully Quilting Your Quilt" You've finished piecing your beautiful quilt top. Now you are faced with how to quilt it. Join Heidi, owner of Heidi's Longarm Quilting Center, as she shares the elements she considers when deciding on how best to enhance the quilt top through the quilting.

**November 3, 2018** Heidi Stagno Workshop: "Rulers, Templates & Stencils"

A little bit of ruler work goes a long way. Enhance your free-motion and feathers with some straight lines. The refined quilting makes the quilt pop! The contrast between the clean straight lines and the movement of the free motion makes for a high end show stopping look.

### OCTOBER MYSTERY QUILT INSTRUCTIONS—Ann Turley

### **Building Blocks**

You have made all the units necessary to construct the blocks, and after this month's installment you will finally get a hint of what they will look like. For each section you will need ONE four-patch unit, ONE dark #1 2-½" square and TWO matching or coordinating pointies. Referencing the photo for color placement, make 36 units.

**SCRAPPY** – pointies should either match or color coordinate. **PLANNED FABRICS** – pointies will match, dark square should be the same fabric as the four-patch. Be mindful of placement of the pointies!

That's all until November.
