Dear September Quilting Sisters,

## Lecture: How to Be a Carefree Quilter

Let's thumb our thimbles at the Quilt Police while we break rules, clash colors and get a little loose with familiar quilt designs. This talk uses my quilts and others as inspiration to go a little beyond your comfort zone with color, shape, embellishment, left over blocks, toward that slippery pin-strewn slope of self-expression. This humorous and revealing digital slide talk inspired by Joy-Lily's recently published book, *Carefree Quilts - A Freestyle Twist On Classic Designs*, will invite all levels of quilters to throw down your pins, quit matching corners, miss the points, and create more exciting fabrics for your quilts.

## Workshop: Lazy Leaves table runner.



This workshop focuses on a project from Joy-Lily's book: Carefree Quilts - A Freestyle Twist on Classic Designs. Discover how much fun it is to quilt in the "perfection-free zone" where seams may wander and points are not always sharp. The Lazy Leaves table runner makes a great project to finish in one day. \$35 registration/no kit fee

## Lecture: Trunk Show---my quilts start to finish

Thom has been fascinated with beads for over 30 years. He has done bead embroidery, jewelry, and added beads to some of his bronze sculptures. He bead embellishes quilts where the beads are embedded in the surface of the quilt and their application does the quilting. Using the quilt as a canvass and the beads as texture and paint, he has developed a unique style combining fabric and beads. He has published a book: *Beading Artistry for Quilters!* 

Workshop: Breads 1—Bead Embroidery for Quilters



The class takes a look at beads, their shapes, varieties of finishes, and their use on quilts to create texture and color changes in the surface. You will learn the basic stitches for applying beads, and what they do to the surface of the quilt, and how the application of beads quilts the surface. This is a process class. The student should have some prior knowledge of hand sewing and hand quilting. \$35 registration/\$25 kit fee

#### **Opportunity Quilt 2015-16 Opportunity Quilt:**

**Treasurer** (Barb Vajda): Our current bank balance is \$30,039.86. Prior month income=\$4282.00 / expenses=\$5135.00.
