### Meetings and Workshops for 2018/2019

**September 13** (*Please note date change*) Nancy Ota presents "Her Long Quilting Journey" A trunk show that takes you through her long quilting journey of many styles. She can't seem to stay with one; she wants to do it all. She will bring about 30 quilts, bags and garments. Her quilts and garments have been in many international shows in the US and even Japan.

**September 14** (*Please note date change; this is on Friday and will start at 10:00 am*)

Nancy Ota Workshop: Sashiko

Sashiko is Nancy's most popular workshop. This is a hand embroidery technique that can be used in quilts and garments. No sewing machine is necessary! Kit fee is \$5.00 or \$20.00 for Two Fans pattern and materials (pictured.)



October 4, 2018 Tina Curran presents "My Design Process —From Concept to Quilt The purpose of this talk is to share Tina's design process, step by step, highlighting the inspirations and obstacles that pop up along the way. Her hope is that this talk will demystify the process for others and encourage them to start designing their own quilts.

October 6

This workshop involves making a pieced background, fussing cutting flowers (from floral fabrics), adding cut stems, and then fusing and raw edge appliquéing all the flower heads and stems to the background fabric. The class project finished at about 24" x 24".

November 1 Heidi Stagno presents "Hints for Successfully Quilting Your Quilt"
You've finished piecing your beautiful quilt top. Now you are faced with how to quilt it. Join Heidi, owner of Heidi's Longarm Quilting Center, as she shares the elements she considers when deciding on how best to enhance the quilt top through the quilting.

November 3, 2018 Heidi Stagno Workshop: "Rulers, Templates & Stencils"

A little bit of ruler work goes a long way. Enhance your free-motion and feathers with some straight lines. The refined quilting makes the quilt pop! The contrast between the clean straight lines and the movement of the free motion makes for a high end show stopping look.

# SEPTEMBER MYSTERY QUILT INSTRUCTIONS—Ann Turley

# Let's Get to the Point!

Gather **72** dark #2 - 4 ½"x 2 ½" rectangles in matched pairs and **72** light 2 ½"squares.

Press the squares in half diagonally, then position on one end of the dark rectangle right side down. Half **(36)** should face left and half **(36)** should face right.

Sew along the pressed diagonal line, then press open. You can either trim away the two lower triangles or leave them intact.

When completed, you will have **36** pairs of Pointies. Bag them and set aside for later.

Next month we will start to assemble a portion of the block.
