# Message from 2nd VP

Here is the scoop on our next speaker and the workshop she is leading. Both she and I have some textile pieces that we are willing to share with anyone who needs some for the workshop. Maybe do some digging in your home for something that you made as a kid, because by now most of those items are vintage, right? Something passed down and never found a place to display it/them until now. If they have stains or yellowing you might try using Retro Clean; it has worked well for me in the past.

Anne Sonner has been making quilts for 40 years. Some are traditional, some are artsy, and most are in between. A lot of her quilts use photos, words, and embellishments from vintage textiles. She started working as a quilt judge for the LA County fair in 2017 with Ann Turley. Anne has had quilts published in several books, including "Photo Memory Quilts" (C&T Publishing, 2023). She is a past president of TLC Quilters in Covina.



#### Workshop: "New Quilts from Old Textiles"

In this class we will play with vintage textile pieces to make a new small quilt. This is an opportunity to figure out what to do with Grandma's doilies, hankies, orphan blocks, old embroidered pieces, etc. It's OK if they're not in mint condition. Garage sale and eBay finds also work. If you are used to following a pattern, this is a chance to try a different approach. Anne will guide and encourage you, and bring examples of different options. Tradition will meet creativity!

Anne is bringing to the May 2 meeting a bin of vintage textile pieces (embroidered pieces, old quilt blocks, lace, yoyos, etc.) to share at no extra charge. Take what you wish from the bin and choose fabrics from your home stash to bring to the workshop that might play well with the vintage pieces. Bring basic sewing supplies and machine (unless you want to do handwork only). If you have a family heirloom to work with, you might also want use a photo of the maker printed on fabric. Embellishments such as buttons, trims and new embroidery can also be used.










Thanks to your generous donations of fabric and time, we've donated 186 quilts to local charities, already exceeding our fiscal year goal of 176!

A few years ago, the guild awarded scholarship monies to a local high school senior and I recently, learned follow up information about one of scholarship recipients. Pictured is the 2023 photo of Katie Hutzler in her cap and gown. This photo was taken at her UCSD graduation and shows Katie standing with her grandmother, Judie Erickson who is now a guild member.

So, here's the latest with Katie. Note that in the photo there's a gold cord around her neck, indicating that she achieved commendable academic success during her undergraduate years. Katie was graduated with a BS in Biology with intent on medical school and since then, has taken an extremely rigorous one-year study at UCSD to prepare candidates for a "Golden Ticket" of sorts to be admitted to a medical school. She will take her MCAT test in the fall and attend med school the following year. Presently she is eying several medical schools in California.


