- 2 ½" x 6" ruler handy ruler that gets the most use

C.A.R.E.S. Donation-Camp Pendleton-Navy Hospital

Last month, we had the joy of delivering 21 baby quilts to Vicky Miller, the Founder and Executive Director of C.A.R.E.S., Caring, Assistance, and Resources in Emergency/Everyday Situations, a non-federal entity at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton. Vicky shared that our beautiful quilts are offered to every new mom by the Labor and Delivery staff, if they have quilts on-hand. In addition, this group provides car seats and diapers to the new parents, of which they have between 80 – 100 babies born each month.

C.A.R.E.S. also provides holiday food and gift baskets to between 150 – 200 families each year.

Vicky thanked us for the beautifully created quilts and knitted afghans that we donated and shared the joy that the new families express upon receiving them.

In addition to the baby donations, we had the pleasure of donating 27 quilts and afghans to Fallbrook Skilled Nursing. Afterward, the Activities Director called to say that every stitch we put into our gifts puts a smile on someone's face.




